Robert Wintemute is a Professor of Human Rights Law at King's College London, who holds degrees from Alberta, McGill and Oxford universities, and came out as the first openly gay lawyer at the law firm Milbank in New York in 1985. His pro bono work there laid the foundation for his participation since 2000 in LGB human rights cases in the European Court of Human Rights, the Court of Justice of the European Union, the Inter-American Court of Human Rights, the Constitutional Court of Colombia, and the Supreme Courts of Argentina, Massachusetts and the United States.
